Cybercrime fraud accounts for 40% of all crime in the UK and continues to grow apace. Most of the perpetrators are outside UK Police jurisdiction so our main means of protection is education on how to spot a scam, what to do if you suspect a scam, and how to avoid being a target in the future. It covers such topics as: Dangers of free Wi-Fi, Scam emails, texts, phone calls, WhatsApp, Contactless bank card frauds, Romance frauds and Passwords. Anybody who uses a computer, iPad/phone or smart phone should attend this talk, it could save you a lot of money!

The sun was shining as 50 members left Westerham for Basildon Park, near Reading. Basildon Hall is an 18th century Palladian style mansion, standing in 300 acres and has passed through several owners. In the 1940s it was requisitioned for US & Canadian troops, resulting in considerable damage, and after an ambitious programme of repair by Lord Iliffe, the owner from 1952, it was gifted to the National Trust in 1978. It is a popular film set, having appeared in such epics as Downton
