Join us for an evening performance of 'The Winslow Boy' by Terence Rattigan on Tuesday, 26th of March at the Miller Centre in Caterham. It is based on the true story of a family fighting to clear their son's name, after he was accused of stealing and subsequently expelled from the Royal Naval College. Tickets are max £14.00 so book your place now.

Another play that has been suggested is 'The Unfriend' starring comedian, Lee Mack, which will certainly put you off wanting to 'keep in touch' with fellow travellers - it can be a big mistake! This will be in late February and tickets are expected to be £45-50. Let Jan know if you are interested.

Tickets for local theatres are much cheaper as illustrated by the Miller Centre above. You may like an evening with 'Blackadder' at Bromley Little Theatre from 8-16th December as an alternative to the pantomime - with tickets at £14 they won't break the bank! Be warned, this is a quirky, homely, converted building and does have some steep steps (there is a lift) but the acting standard is exceptionally high. When you book a place for any organised event you make a commitment as usually the price is dependent on the number attending. Once you have paid for your ticket then there can be no refunds. We know there are always justifiable reasons why you cannot attend but it is your responsibility to either find a replacement or forfeit the money, the u3a cannot bear the cost of unsold tickets. This is exactly what would happen if you had bought the ticket direct from the theatre, albeit at an increased price! It is always worth contacting the organiser to see if there is a waiting list and it may be possible to circulate details to the whole u3a membership.
